We are the independent group that has been set up to look at how the UK dealt with Covid-19.



An **Inquiry** is when a group of people look at what happened and tell everyone the facts about what happened.



The Inquiry will try to:


• Find answers to people's questions about the pandemic.



• Make sure that lessons are learned for the future.

About 'Every Story Matters'









The Inquiry has started a project called 'Every Story Matters', so people from across the UK can share their stories with us.

These stories will help the Inquiry:

• To understand what happened to people during the pandemic.



• With its important legal work.



We want to hear from lots of people across the UK, including people whose loved ones died during the pandemic.

What does the Inquiry want to know?



The pandemic affected everybody in different ways.

Some changes have carried on and lasted for a long time.

We want to understand how the pandemic made you feel.

We want to know what happened to you and why.

You can tell us about any part of your life that you like.



You can also tell us how the pandemic affected your friends, family and community.



If you choose to share your story with us, please do not include your name or phone number.



When you have finished telling us your story, we will ask for some general information like your gender, age and postcode.

You don't have to tell us if you don't want to.



But the information will help us to understand more about how the pandemic affected different groups of people.



If you tell us that someone is in danger, we may need to tell the police and other organisations such as social services.

How can people take part in 'Every Story Matters'?



You can decide if you want to take part or not. Everybody has a choice.

You must be aged 18 or over to take part.

It does not matter if you had Covid or not during the pandemic.

Most people can share their story by filling in a form on our website.

You can also ask for a paper form. This will be sent to you in the post and you can fill it in with a pen and send it back to us.



We may invite you to come and speak to us more about the pandemic.



We will also have events across the country where people can tell us about their experiences.

How will you use my information?



The Inquiry will collect stories from lots of people across the UK.



We will use computers and people to study the stories.



We will find out if people had similar or different experiences.



We will look for patterns and find things that could be improved.



The Inquiry will use the information in our **legal hearings**.

A **legal hearing** is an official meeting in a court.

The information we collect will help us to do things in our legal hearings, like:

- Ask questions to the people who were in charge during the pandemic.
- Make recommendations so things can be better in the future.

We will make reports available to everyone, with information from all the collected stories.

The reports will not include any personal information about you if you shared your story. No one will know who you are.

We will also share the phone number with groups that work with people with learning disabilities.

People might have a lot of different feelings when filling in the form.


